Community Development and Disaster/Resiliency Planning

Ayşe Yonder is a professor emeritus of city planning and former Chair of the Graduate Center for Planning and the Environment at Pratt Institute. Her work focuses on community development and participatory planning processes, disaster and resiliency planning, informal settlements regularization, and the role of arts and culture in urban development with a focus on gender issues. She has worked for over 20 years with the Huairou Commission, an international network of grassroots women's organizations on policy advocacy, technical support and community engagement. In NYC, she has worked with community-based organizations through her studio courses and the Pratt Center for Community Development, and helped organize community-visioning sessions. Ayşe has a PhD in City and Regional Planning from the University of California, Berkeley, a Masters in City Planning from the University of Pennsylvania and a 5-year Architecture degree from Istanbul Technical University in Turkey.
