**CAITLIN CAHILL**  
**Community Participation and Environmental Psychology**

Caitlin Cahill is a community-based participatory researcher and environmental psychologist and is currently an Associate Professor of Urban Geography and Politics at Pratt Institute, where she co-coordinates the Social Justice/Social Practice Minor. She collaborates with communities to document and take action upon the everyday intimate experience of racial capitalism as it concerns gentrification, immigration, education, and state violence. Recent projects include the Emancipatory Urban Futures project with Iyapo Repository, and the Bushwick Action Research Collective and Growing Up Policed, in partnership with the Public Science Project and Make the Road New York. In Salt Lake City, Utah, Caitlin co-founded the Mestizo Arts & Activism Collective, an intergenerational social justice think tank led by the urgent concerns of young people. Caitlin's work has been published widely in journals and edited collections. Committed to interdisciplinary, engaged scholarship, Caitlin has received several awards including a special recognition from the ACLU for collaborative work addressing immigration rights. Caitlin is on the editorial boards of *Metropolitica*, *Community Development*, *Children's Geographies*, and *Children, Youth & Environments*. She has a PhD in Environmental Psychology from the Graduate Center of the City University of New York.
