## EVREN UZER

Community Engagement and Community Planning and Design

Evren Uzer is an educator, urban planner, and community practitioner working on civic engagement in planning and design. She is Assistant Professor of Urban Planning at the School of Design Strategies (SDS) at Parsons School of Design. Her current research focuses on feminist spatial practices, community solidarity, and critical heritage studies. She is project lead on the Community Engagement 101 project, which explores and creates training focusing on ethical and mutually beneficial engagement practices between higher education institutions and external partners. Evren's practice is currently split between community engagement, planning and design work at the Collective for Community, Culture and Environment and her artistic practice at roomservices. Through these two initiatives, she works on advocacy planning, artistic research, co-design, and non-academic and non-conventional forms of publishing.

Her recent publications explore cultural heritage issues in "Theorizing Heritage through Resistance"; community and collective memory in "Mending Collective Memory," *Garland* magazine; and design and creative resistance in "Beautiful Trouble: A Pattern Language of Creative Resistance," a chapter in *Design and Political Dissent: Spaces, Visuals, Materialities*.

Evren has a PhD in Urban and Regional Planning and an MS and BS from the Istanbul Technical University in Turkey.
